Annual General Meeting Highlights

Casera held its Annual General Meeting in April via videoconference. In 2021, assets grew by 3.25 percent to \$466 million, deposits increased by 2.94 percent to \$432 million, loans expanded by 5.79 percent to \$414 million, and Casera's net income was \$2.1 million. As a result, our financial position remains strong.

At the Annual General Meeting, Kyle Mager, East Winnipeg Sports Association, and St. Vital Museum received Casera Community Awards for Leadership and Enrichment.

Casera launched its new digital banking platform on May 10, 2022. Since then, over 90 percent of the credit union's active digital banking users have logged in to the benefits of online banking and the Casera CU Mobile App.

"The new platform has quickly been accepted by our members because it offers a wealth of new security enhancements, such as one-time passwords and security alerts," explains Brent Thomas, Casera's CEO. "For example, more than a dozen transactions require authentication with a one-time password received via text message or email."

Resetting usernames and passwords have become easier to achieve with the new platform. Now, if you forget your username, you can easily retrieve it on your own by using the convenient "recover username" function. And, if you forget your password, you can easily reset it on your own by using the "reset password" function.

An abundance of customizable features reflects the platform's flexibility. You can now transfer money quickly, conveniently, and safely to and from US accounts. Registering for account alerts ensures that you'll be notified immediately when any incorrect or fraudulent transactions occur. You also have the capacity to download voided cheques, making it easier to set up your auto-debits and auto-deposits.

A newly designed website is also part of the digital banking platform. According to Thomas, the site delivers a user-friendly online experience that is viewable on any size device. In addition, the new mobile app combines online banking features with the website's new, updated look.

"There are 13 short, easy-to-understand digital banking demos available on our website that take you through all the procedures required to conduct online transactions, such as sending an *Interac* e-Transfer®, paying a bill, or resetting your password," he says. "You can quickly and easily learn about all the digital banking options at Casera."

Getting around Casera's website has become easier, according to Thomas. Whether you're looking for personal banking services or services for businesses or community organizations, you'll find it just a click away.

"We've improved the site's navigation significantly," he explains. "The tools you need to benefit from online banking are easy to find and easy to use.

Helpful Suggestions for Buying a Used Car

Recent supply chain shortages have impacted the availability of new vehicles in some markets. As a result, many buyers are taking a second look at the used car market.

One of the best reasons for buying a used vehicle is that it has depreciated for several years. Used cars lose value slower than new ones, reducing your overall cost of driving.

Depending on their age, many used vehicles may not include a warranty, meaning you will be responsible for the cost of future repairs. Some consider a new vehicle with a warranty better than a used car without one. That is for you to decide. However, consider the tips below if you're in the market for a used car.

Have a Mechanic Look at it

One of the most important steps when buying a used vehicle is having it inspected by a mechanic. Many sellers will be comfortable with you taking the car to a mechanic for a quick look-over. If that's not possible, consider bringing a trusted mechanic with you when you check out the car. While there, they can look it over for rust, mechanical issues, and more.

Dealerships Charge Tax

When registering a car you purchased in Manitoba, you must pay provincial sales tax (PST) to Manitoba Public Insurance. If you purchase your vehicle from a private citizen, this is the only sales tax you will pay.

You will also pay goods and service tax (GST) when buying a used car from a dealership. This tax is paid directly to the dealership at the time of the sale.

Check the Vehicle's History

By using a service like CARFAX (www.carfax.ca), you can determine if a vehicle was written off in an accident or has a history of any severe damage from something like a flood. Sellers may not always share this with you outright, so don't hesitate to do some digging on your own.

Organize Your Financial Documents Like a Professional

An easy-to-follow filing system makes it easier to find what you need and, come tax time, provides records without a stressful weekend of digging through papers.

STEP 1: Getting Started

Sort documents into logical groups, then start digitizing the documents from one of the groups (something like a vehicle, your home, or former tax returns). Once you finish up that group, move on to the next.

STEP 2: Digitize Everything

Free up space at home and reduce clutter/confusion. Unless you are required to keep a physical copy of a document, shred it securely after recording it.

STEP 3: Develop an Electronic Folder System

Make it easy to navigate your documents by getting in the habit of digitizing and immediately filing items electronically as you receive them in the future.

STEP 4: Switch to Digital First (Where You Can)

Wherever possible, opt-out of paper statements or invoices. Many places provide you with the option of receiving statements via email or a secure portal in digital form. Some items aren't digital yet, so find a safe place for them.
